ANDERSON CUP KWANMUKAN RULES

This is a special competition and each Kwanmukan school has 90 days to prepare their competitors. Below are the general rules. If something is not addressed, the Kwanmukan will make a determination as it sees fit. Please note changes from last year.

- 1) The cup will be for Juniors ages 6-17, two adult divisions and 3 adult male and female divisions.
- 2) Each Kwanmukan School/Branch shall be entitled to enter 1 male and 1 female competitor in each age division. Divisions will be novice and advanced for age 8 and over. Dojo's will hold their own qualifications as necessary to determine who will represent their school. All competitors must be registered by their school by November 24. An alternative may also be registered.
- 3) Each dojo will name one judge and one alternate judge. Judges chosen must agree not to be involved in any training of the competitors for this cup. That is, if you train the competitors, you do not judge. Those who judge youth divisions may compete in adult or senior divisions. Judges may compete in the adult divisions. The director of the International Kwanmukan shall name other judges as appropriate. The Shihan board will oversee the judging panel.
- 4) Entry fee will be \$35 per competitor. We will give a special trophy to the winner and medals to all.
- 5) Competition will be under the Anderson Cup Rules of judging.
- 6) The competition will be held at Hickey Karate Center with staggering starts throughout the day to keep attendance under control.
- 7) Divisions each age 6-17 will be a division with separate divisions for males and females. (This is a change over last year.) This each dojo can enter one male and one female in each age group. We will not split divisions unless we get more than 8 entries in an age group. Note, we will know this by July 22 as each school may register their competitors by July 22. Schools may register an alternative in an event in case the qualified entry cannot make the competition. Should a division exceed 8 entries, then we will split by sex, not rank. Divisions of 2 or less competitors may be combined upwards or downwards in the opinion of the Kwanmukan. The adult divisions are age 18-35 and 35-50 male and female and senior will be 50 and over, again split male and female.
- 8) All competitors will wear blue belts during the entire competition to disguise rank. No school patches or other identifying school/dojo marks. Kwanmukan patches are okay if they do not show school/dojo affiliation. We ask that dojo t-shirts and the like also not be worn before competing and are okay afterwards. As much as is possible, we do not want the referees to know the dojo of the competitor.

9) Competitors will present as follows

Youth Divisions

- Age 6 and 7 One division two Kwanbu and Taikyoku Shodan or Heian Shodan
- Age 8 Novice two Kwanbu and choice of Taikyoku Shodan or Heian Shodan or Heian Nidan
- Age 8 Advanced two Kwanbu and choice of Taikyoku Shodan or Heian Shodan or Heian Nidan
- Age 9 Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan or Heian 1-3
- Age 9 Advanced three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan or Heian 1-3 or Kwanmu 1
- Age 10 Novice three Kwanbu and choice of Heian 1-4
- Age 10 Advanced three Kwanbu and choice of Heian 1-4 or Kwanmu 1
- Age 11 Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan or Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Age 11 Advanced three Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1 and choice of one kata from Heian 1-5
- Age 12 Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan or Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Age 12 Advanced Four Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1 and 2 and choice of one kata from Heian 1-5 in final round
- Age 13 Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan or Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Age 13 Advanced Four Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1 and 2 and choice of one kata from Heian 1-5 in final round
- Age 14 Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan or Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Age 14 Advanced Five Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1 and 2 and 3 and choice of one advanced kata for final round
- Age 15 Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan or Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Age 15 Advanced Five Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1 and 2 and 3 and choice of one advanced kata for final round or Kwanmu 1
- Age 16 Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan or Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Age 16 Advanced Five Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1 and 2 and 3 and choice of one advanced kata for final round
- Age 17 Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan or Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Age 17 Advanced Five Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1 and 2 and 3 and choice of one advanced kata for final round

Adult and Senior Divisions

- Adult age 18 to 35 – Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan, Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Adult age 45 to 55 – Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan, Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Adults age 55 and over – Novice three Kwanbu and two kata from Taikyoku Shodan, Heian 1-5 or Kwanmu 1
- Adult age 18 to 35 – Advanced Five Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1,2,3, and 4 in final round only
- Adults age 45 and over – Five Advanced Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1,2,3, and 4 in final round only
- Adults age 55 and over – Five Advanced Kwanbu and Kwanmu 1,2,3, and 4 in final round only
